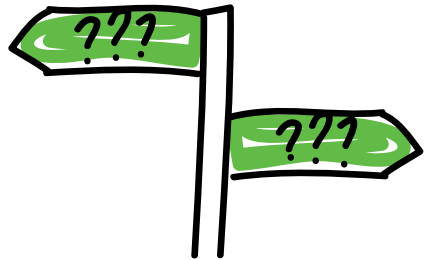

THINKING ABOUT POST-SECONDARY?



You'll need: HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA or GED or AGE 19+

* These factors can affect where you'll be eligible to go :

the **type** of courses

Programs have specific prerequisite & recommended courses

the **level** of courses

College: U/M/C
University:
ENG4U + U/M

the **grades** in those courses

Programs have specific grade requirements

*There may be additional requirements (reference letters, extracurriculars, etc.).
Always check the details of the programs to which you are looking to apply!*

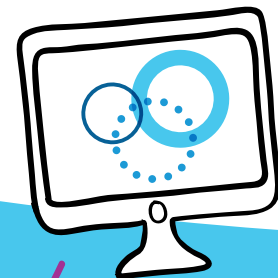

TRANSFER TIPS

- Plan your postsecondary pathway early, at www.ontransfer.ca to help you choose the right courses for transfer.
- You may need your previous **course outlines** for transfer. Check with the institution to find out what documents you will need.
- Things to consider:
 - **grade** you get in a course - institutions have a minimum grade requirement for granting transfer credits.
 - **when** you take a course - institutions want to make sure that what you learn is up-to-date & consistent with their curriculum.
 - **where** you take most of your courses - residency requirements at institutions mean you must take a minimum number of courses at the institution to be granted a diploma or degree.
